Clarke Award and Prince of Asturias Award for Literature, has been shortlisted for the Booker Prize five times, winning once, and has been a finalist for the Governor General's Award several times, winning twice. In 2001 she was inducted into Canada's Walk of Fame.

Before you read:

Language

The language in the novel can prove to be difficult at times. There are several reasons for this:

- 1) complex vocabulary
- 2) scientific jargon
- 3) invented words

However, do not be discouraged by this. Simply keep reading and do not interrupt the flow unless you feel it is absolutely necessary to look up a word, because you do not understand anything. Even if you do not grasp the meaning of some words, you can certainly get a handle on the main storylines.

Flashbacks

The story uses two timelines:

- 1) Snowman and life after the apocalypse
- 2) Jimmy and the life before the apocalypse

Snowman and Jimmy are one and the same person.

Psychological time

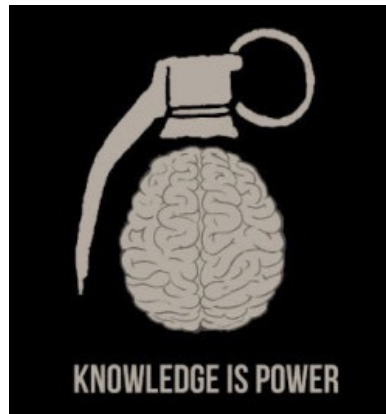

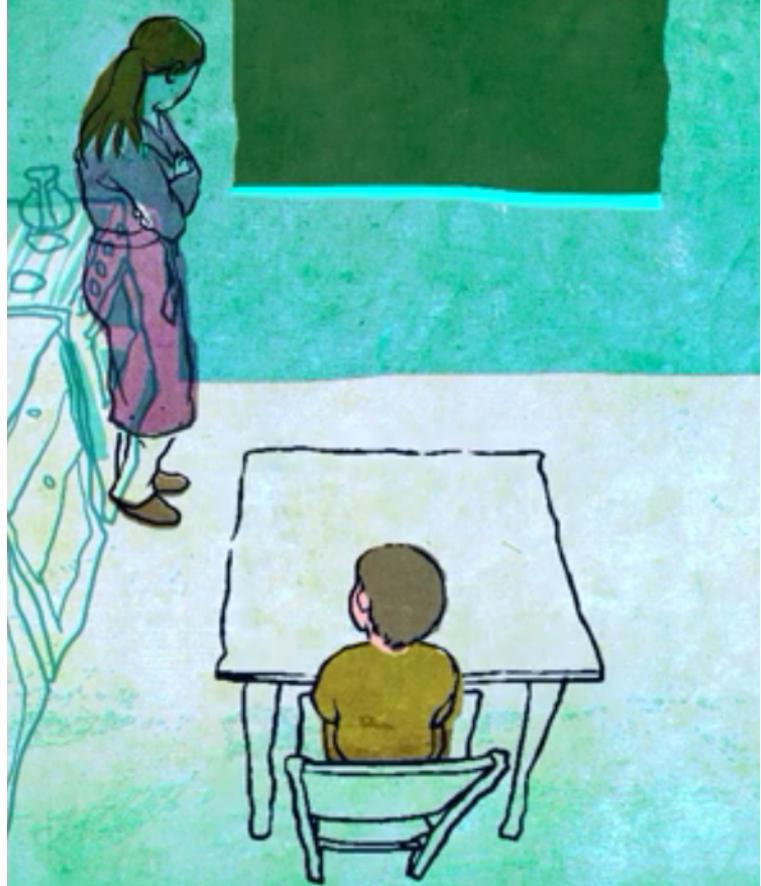

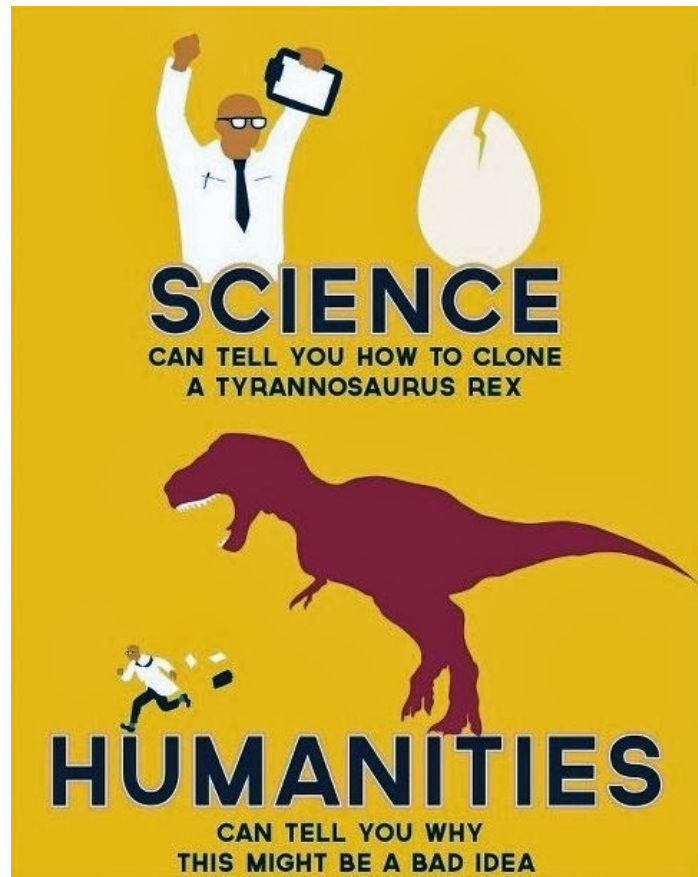

Jean Baudrillard

French social theorist who argues that today “the map precedes the territory.” In other words, copies of reality become truths in their own right. What does this mean? Here’s an example. You have yet to leave home and study at a university. You have no idea what university life is like. However, movies like American Pie and Van Wilder feed you with expectations and behaviour patterns: lots of drinking, parties and sex. So you adopt this behaviour based on expectations that might have nothing to do with reality. Hence the simulation becomes reality.

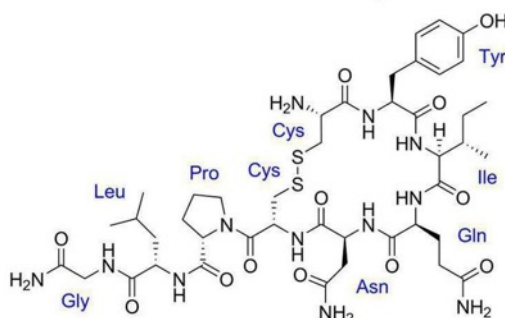

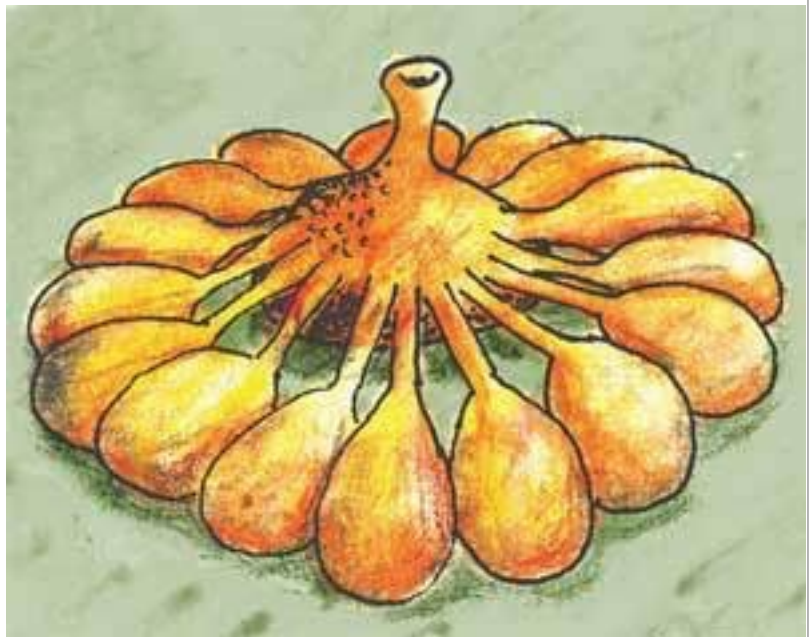

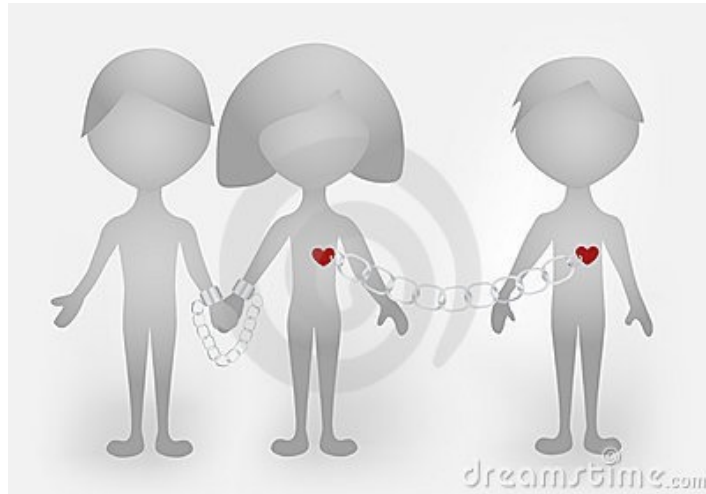
